Lina Ghotmeh — Architecture

Ghotmeh (b. 1980) was born in Beirut, where she studied at the American University, and then taught at the École Spéciale d'Architecture in Paris between 2008 and 2015. In 2005, while working in London and collaborating with Ateliers Jean Nouvel and Foster + Partners, she won a competition to design the Estonian National Museum (below) – after which she established her own studio. Her practice is driven by a desire to connect with people and the natural world. Ghotmeh was nominated for the Moira Gemmill Prize for Emerging Architecture from the Women in Architecture awards in 2019.
